

### **Question 3 – August 15**

A 43 year old female with PSC was found to have a 9 mm lesion in her gallbladder suspicious for a gallbladder polyp. What is the next best step in management of the polyp?

- A. Repeat ultrasound in 1 year
- B. Repeat ultrasound in 6 months
- C. Cholecystectomy
- D. Reassurance

**Answer: C**

Cholecystectomy is recommended for Gallbladder polyps more than 8 mm in patients with PSC unlike the 10 mm cut-off for non-PSC patients. Annual ultrasound is recommended for screening for GB cancer in patients with PSC.
