

**Question 39 – May 1**

Pancreatic serous cystadenomas have a unique epithelium characterized by the presence of:

- A. Mucin secretion
- B. Malignancy
- C. Intracellular glycogen
- D. Histocytes

**Answer: C**

Serous cystadenomas have a simple, thin, cuboidal epithelium that does not secrete mucin. The epithelial cells in a serous cystadenoma stain positive for PAS and this represents the presence of glycogen.
